Evidence on Copyright: An Open Knowledge Approach

Open knowledge offers powerful tools to understand and collaborate on research about copyright's effects. This session will demonstrate the Copyright Evidence Wiki project (CopyrightEvidence.org) and show how it can be used by everyone to connect and explore data about copyright drawn from over 800 studies around the world. Live case studies by the project team, led by the University of Glasgow, will explore current topics in copyright policy, including the impact on **libraries, archives and museums, user rights and exceptions, digitization, cultural heritage preservation and educational uses.**
